WHEREAS, The 1957 session of the legislature created an Interim Committee on Indian Affairs by House Concurrent Resolution Number Seven, which committee has reported to this session of the legislature, and

WHEREAS, since the committee reported it has become possible to arrange a conference in Washington ,D. C., with officials of the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the U.S. Public Health Service to discuss:

- (1) Medical care for the Nett Lake Indians;
- (2) Drugs for the Nett Lake Indians;
- (3) The preparation of a contract for health services for the Nett Lake Indians similar to the Minnesota Sioux contract;
- (4) Arrangements for the continued operation of the federal Red Lake Indian Hospital by the U.S. Public Health Service:
- (5) Increased federal appropriations for community hospitals in Indian areas;
- (6) Concluding a contract between the state and the Bureau of Indian Affairs for foster care for Indian children; and,
- (7) Negotiation of education contracts as they pertain to P. L. 874 for Minnesota Indians; and,

WHEREAS, although the committee has already reported, and although a deficiency exists in the funds appropriated for its study, the information that may be secured by such a conference will be valuable to this session of the legislature;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring, that the members of the Interim Committee on Indian Affairs created by House Concurrent Resolution number seven of the sixtieth session are hereby authorized to travel to Washington, D. C., to confer with officials of the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the U.S. Public Health Service.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that legislative members of the committee are hereby excused from attendance at sessions of their respective houses of this legislature during the time they are necessarily absent for the aforesaid purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring, that there is hereby appropriated out of the legislative expense fund so much thereof as may be necessary to cover the necessary expenses of the members of the committee incurred while carrying out the aforesaid purpose and to cover the expenses of the committee previously incurred for the payment of which no funds remain in its appropriation.

The resolution was referred to the Committee on Rules.

### HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 2

A Concurrent Resolution Providing Living Expenses During the Session of the Legislature for Members of the Legislature.

*Be It Resolved*, by the House of Representatives of the State of Minnesota, the Senate concurring, that the Chief Clerk of the House is hereby authorized and directed to prepare and issue warrants in payment of living expenses to each member of the House and the Secretary of the Senate is hereby authorized and directed to prepare and issue warrants in payment of living expenses to each member of the Senate, from the Legislative Expense Fund, in the sum of \$12.00 per diem for each calendar day of the 1959 Legislative Session.

*Resolved Further*, that the per diem living expenses herein provided for of \$12.00 per diem shall be paid to such members who have moved from their usual place of lodging during a substantial part of the 1959 Session of the Legislature;

*Provided Further*, that the per diem living expenses of members of the Legislature who have not so changed their place of lodging for a substantial part of said Session shall be the sum of \$8.00 per day.

*Provided Further*, each member of the Legislature shall certify in writing to the Chief Clerk of the House or to the Secretary of the Senate prior to the issuance of the first of such warrants for such living expenses whether or not he has moved from his usual place of lodging.

*Provided Further*, that any member of the House or Senate not voting affirmatively on this resolution shall be considered as having indicated to the Legislature his intention not to accept expenses for the 1959 Session, and the Chief Clerk of the House and the Secretary of the Senate shall not draw vouchers for expenses for such member unless said member makes application

to the Rules Committee of the House, if a member of the House, or the Committee on Rules and Legislative Expenses of the Senate, if a member of the Senate, indicating his desire for such expenses and requesting payment thereof, whereupon the respective committees shall authorize such payment.

Mr. Cina moved that House Concurrent Resolution No. 2 be adopted.

Mr. Duxbury moved to amend House Concurrent Resolution No. 2 by striking the period at the end of the first paragraph thereof, inserting in lieu thereof a comma and adding the following language: not exceeding one hundred days.
